Addressing base erosion and profit shifting (BEPS) is a key priority of governments. In 2013, OECD and G20 countries, working together on an equal footing, adopted a 15-point Action Plan to address BEPS. This publication is the final report for Action 12. The report examines a draft plan, prepared by the Environmental Protection Agency, that identifies critical security issues for drinking water and wastewater and outlines related

research and technical support needs. This report recommends increased attention to interagency coordination and encourages additional consideration of current restrictions on secure information dissemination. It further suggests that EPA incorporate the results of their research activities into an integrated water security guidance document to improve support for water and wastewater utilities. This policy brief reviews current progress on implementing Burkina Faso's national action plan on antimicrobial resistance (AMR), identifies critical

gaps and highlights findings to accelerate further progress in the human health sector. The brief compiles information obtained through a comprehensive review of relevant publicly available and ministry-sourced data and documents supplemented with key informant interviews with national AMR focal points. Degradation of forests can have severe negative local impacts and far-reaching consequences,

This action plan, created in response to a request by the G20, identifies a set of domestic and international actions to address the problems of

base erosion and profit sharing. The Action Plan for Australian Birds 2010 is the third in a series of action plans that have been produced at the start of each decade. The book analyses the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) status of all the species and subspecies of Australia's birds, including those of the offshore territories. For each bird the size and trend in their population and distribution has been analysed using the latest iteration of IUCN Red List Criteria to determine their risk of extinction. The book also provides an account of all those species and

subspecies that are or are likely to be extinct. Each categorisation is justified on the basis of the latest research, including much unpublished material that has been made available during workshops conducted with leading ornithologists and conservation biologists around the country as well as phone interviews and correspondence. The result is the most authoritative account yet of the status of Australia's birds.
